INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Investor Fund is a USD-denominated equity Unit Investment Trust Fund structured as a feeder fund and aims to provide market returns from a representative portfolio of stocks that comprise the Japan Equity Market by investing at least 90% of its assets in the iSHARES MSCI JAPAN ETF. The Fund's benchmark is the MSCI Daily TR Net Japan (NDDUJN Index).

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process is performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are encouraged to update the resulting profile every three (3) years or if there's any change in his/her personal/financial circumstances. Before deciding to invest, clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, or seek an independent/professional opinion when necessary.

The METRO\$ JAPAN EQUITY FEEDER FUND is suitable only for investors who:

- Have an Aggressive profile.
- Want capital appreciation over the long-term by primarily investing in iSHARES MSCI JAPAN ETF
- Recommended investment horizon is at least five (5) years
- Participation in the Fund shall be open to Filipino individuals, resident and non-resident aliens and corporate accounts.

KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

You should not invest in this Fund if you do not understand or are not comfortable with the accompanying risks.

Market/Price Risk:	The possibility for an investor to experience losses due to changes in the market prices of stocks/equities. It refers to the portfolio's exposure to marked-to-market valuation due to market price fluctuations of the stocks/equities.
Liquidity Risk:	The possibility for an investor to experience losses due to the inability to sell or convert assets into cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a price that could result in a loss. 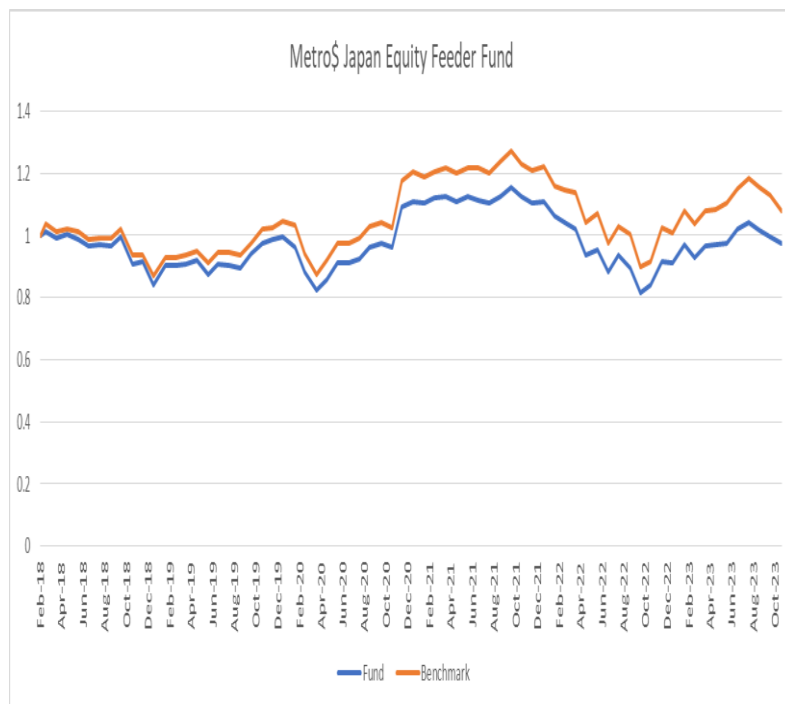

³ Sharpe Ratio is used to characterize how well the return of a Fund compensates the investor for the level of risk taken. The higher the number, the better.

⁴ Information Ratio measures reward-to-risk efficiency of the portfolio relative to the benchmark. The higher the number, the higher the reward per unit of risk.

⁵ Tracking Error measures the deviation between the Fund's return and benchmark return since the Fund's inception. The lower the number, the more aligned the Fund's return is with the benchmark. (Starting September 2021 report the basis for the Tracking Error computation is since the Fund's inception.)

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INVESTMENT POLICY

A. The Fund may be invested and reinvested in the following instruments:

- USD-denominated units/shares in collective investment schemes subject to the conditions under BSP Circular 767
- USD-denominated deposits
- Other traded money market instruments
- Other USD-denominated Investments allowed under BSP regulations

B. The Investor Fund may invest a minimum of 90% of its fund in the Target Fund and a maximum of 10% in cash, deposits and other money market instruments. The investment of the Investor Fund in any Target Fund shall not exceed 10% of the Total Net Asset Value of the Target Fund.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

The fund decreased 2.08% for the month, in-line with the target fund's decrease of 2.19%. The fund's outperformance was due to the cash allocation of the fund. The fund will be re-deploying cash in key support levels.

The Bank of Japan (BOJ) committed to its ultra-loose monetary policy stance in October, leaving rates unchanged at -0.1%. On the other hand, the central bank allowed yields to rise more freely as the Japanese 10Y rose to 0.94%, the highest level in over a decade.

Despite policymakers raising their inflation forecast for 2023 and 2024, Japan's October CPI slowed to 3% from 3.2%. Joblessness declined to 2.6% from 2.7%, retail sales decline YoY to 5.8% while household spending declined 2.5% YoY. Investors remain focus on the country's wage growth, where a move higher in pay could get the BOJ closer to its inflation targets. Although YoY PPI grew 2%, manufacturing PMI fell deeper into contraction at 48.5 versus 49.6 the month prior.

The downtrend in Japanese equity markets seem to be mild as markets remain resilient compared to developed market peers. The slope of the market decline resembles a potential "bull-flag", which maybe a set-up to a year-end rally. The risk-off in October that plagued global markets was driven by a painful bear steepening as longer-term yields rose under the 'soft landing' narrative. The yield on U.S. 10-year Treasury bonds closed at 4.93%, marking a 36-basis point increase and reaching the highest level since 2007. The negative spread between the U.S. 10-year and 2-year narrowed from 47bps to 16bps. It's important to note that an inverted yield curve signals an impending recession, while the un-inversion of the yield curve signals the onset of a recession. The risk-off sentiment in various markets prompted a 0.46% month-over-month strengthening of the U.S. dollar, closing at USD106.66.
