INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Investor Fund is a USD-denominated Unit Investment Trust Fund structured as a feeder fund and aims to provide market returns from a representative portfolio of USD-denominated investment grade corporate bonds that comprise the US Investment Grade Corporate Bond Market by investing at least 90% of its assets in the iSHARES IBOXX \$ INVESTMENT GRADE CORPORATE BOND ETF. The Fund's benchmark is the iBoxx USD Liquid Investment Grade Index TR.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process is performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are encouraged to update the resulting profile every three (3) years or if there's any change in his/her personal/financial circumstances. Before deciding to invest, clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, or seek an independent/professional opinion when necessary.

The METRO\$ US INVESTMENT GRADE CORPORATE BOND FEEDER FUND is suitable only for investors who:

- Have an Aggressive profile.
- Want capital appreciation over the long-term by primarily investing in iSHARES IBOXX \$ INVESTMENT GRADE CORPORATE BOND ETF
- Recommended investment horizon is at least five (5) years
- Participation in the Fund shall be open to Filipino individuals, resident and non-resident aliens and corporate accounts.

KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

You should not invest in this Fund if you do not understand or are not comfortable with the accompanying risks.

Interest Rate Risk:	The possibility for an investor to experience losses due to changes in interest rates. The purchase and sale of a debt instrument may result in profit or loss because the value of a debt instrument changes inversely with prevailing interest rates.
Market/Price Risk:	The possibility for an investor to experience losses due to changes in the market prices of stocks/equities. It refers to the portfolio's exposure to marked-to-market valuation due to market price fluctuations of the stocks/equities.

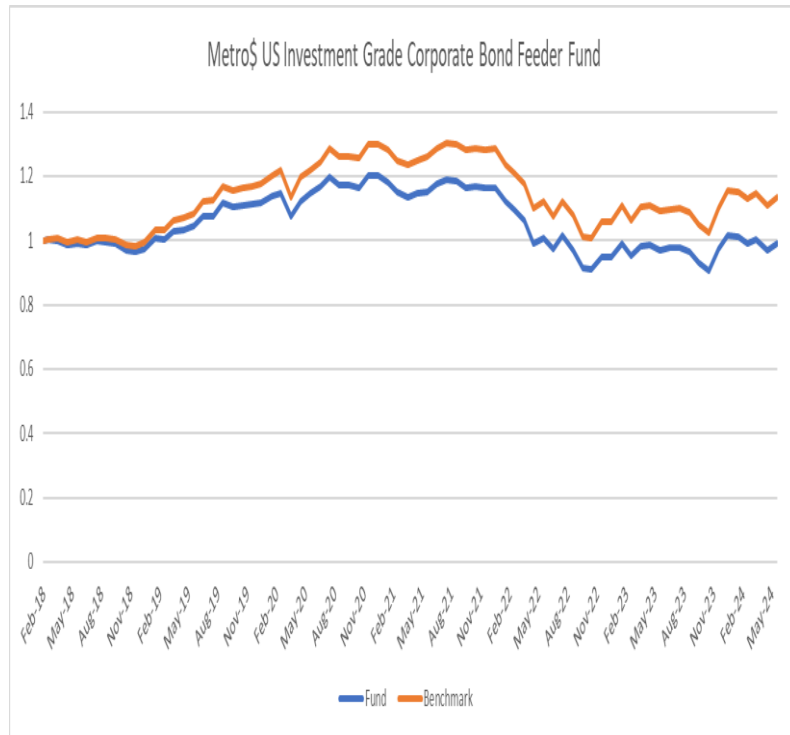

³ Sharpe Ratio is used to characterize how well the return of a Fund compensates the investor for the level of risk taken. The higher the number, the better.

⁴ Information Ratio measures reward-to-risk efficiency of the portfolio relative to the benchmark. The higher the number, the higher the reward per unit of risk.

⁵ Tracking Error measures the deviation between the Fund's return and benchmark return since the Fund's inception. The lower the number, the more aligned the Fund's return is with the benchmark. (Starting September 2021 report the basis for the Tracking Error computation is since the Fund's inception.)

INVESTMENT POLICY

A. The Fund may be invested and reinvested in the following instruments:

- USD-denominated deposits
- USD-denominated money market instruments
- Other USD-denominated investments allowed under BSP regulations
- Financial derivatives instruments solely for the purpose of hedging risk exposures of the existing investments of the Investor Fund

B. The Investor Fund may invest a minimum of 90% of its fund in the target Fund and a maximum of 10% in cash, deposits and other money market instruments. The investment of the Investor Fund in any one Target Fund shall not exceed 10% of the Total Net Asset Value of the Target Fund.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

The fund increased by 1.99% for the month of May, as weaker data support to the much-awaited policy easing cycle. This fund is geared to do well in a disinflationary or deflationary market phase. Rising yields would be opportunities to add duration.

Don't be fooled, the economic regime is disinflationary, not inflationary, for now.

In the April FOMC meeting, rates were kept unchanged at 5.25% to 5.5%, with some central bank officials dialing back rate cut expectations in 2024. However, Fed Chair Powell stated that it is unlikely that the next move of the central bank will be a hike. As of the end of May, markets anticipate only one cut in 2024, with the pivot expected in November.

While the Fed maintains its hawkish pause, economic data continued to validate the weakness seen in Q1-2024. GDP was revised lower from 1.6% to 1.3%, as personal consumption declined more than expected from 2.5% to 2.0%. It is important to note that inflationary price pressures may be sticky in the short term, but the restrictive monetary environment will continue to put downward pressure on consumption. CPI YoY inched lower to 3.4% while unemployment ticked up to 3.9%, with recent data hinting at weaker GDP in Q2-2024.

Since 2023, the wealth effect has played a major part in the sticky inflation story. However, the recent drop in consumer sentiment from 77.2 to 69.1, while U.S. equity markets continue to push new all-time highs, signals a deterioration to the consumer. The lag effect from the aggressive rate hikes is here and is altering consumption and consumer behavior towards a descending path.

The bond market continues to expect a recession as the 2-year US Treasury (US2Y) vs. 10-year US Treasury (US10Y) yields remain inverted. The US10Y dropped 18 bps in May following the skew to weaker economic data. As expected, US10Y yields topped at 4.7%, confirming the bear-flag pattern; yields are expected to trend lower in the coming months as weak economic data continues. The Dollar Index (DXY) dropped 1.46% to 104.67. Central banks cutting ahead of the Fed may prompt the dollar to strengthen in the near term.

In the short to medium term, push-pull in yields can be expected from weakening economic data and the USD 10 trillion that needs to be refinanced by the US government. The 2024 U.S. Presidential elections continue to add uncertainty to the inflation trajectory, but given recent developments, a mild recession scenario can no longer be ignored.

Additionally, the fund is capitalizing on favorable dollar time deposit rates, offering a 90-day yield of 5.30%.
